


- EU Sustainable Urban Development (SUD) 2014-2020 and 2021-2027
- Supports local authorities, managing authorities, practitioners with the design and implementation of EU integrated urban strategies.
- Structured around six building blocks, among which:
 Monitoring
- To tackle the main issues and challenges through **examples**, data, external resources, and recommendations.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- Use a logical framework: Move from needs 'what has to be addressed?' to specific objectives 'what is the desired change?' to indicators 'how can this change be measured?'
- Involve external expertise
- Explore ways to measure the effect of an integrated approach.
- Use quantitative and qualitative information to cover all dimensions.
- Take **timing** into account, particularly for **intangible effects**.
- Create a dashboard
- Establish cooperation between local authorities to create strong sub-national mechanisms for monitoring higher level agendas.


